

**William W. Feaster, MD, MBA, CPE**  
**Assistant Treasurer**

After finishing residencies in Anesthesia and Pediatrics, and pursuing fellowship training in neonatology and pediatric anesthesia and critical care, Dr. Feaster began his clinical career at Children's Hospital Oakland in 1981. At Children's, he practiced both pediatric anesthesia and critical care, developed and led Children's Anesthesia Medical Group and held multiple other leadership positions within the hospital. Included in these duties was participation on the hospital's finance committee and an advisory role to IT, which included participation in the selection and implementation of the hospital's current Meditech hospital information system.

In order to pursue a career more heavily focused on hospital and group administration, Dr. Feaster completed an M.B.A. at St. Mary's College in 1993, with a focus in finance. That year, he moved his practice and administrative work to Sutter Health, where he worked as a pediatric and OB anesthesiologist with the CASE group and served as Medical Director of women and children's services for the Central Region of Sutter. During his years with Sutter Health, he founded a large multi-specialty group practice, built pediatric and obstetric services, participated in many of the organization's IT projects, including a system wide strategic plan, and guided a selection process for the systems current Epic ambulatory EMR.

In 1998, Dr. Feaster left practice for a position as Sr. Vice President, Chief Medical Officer at Community Medical Center, a three-hospital system in Fresno, California. In his three-plus years there, he added various administrative responsibilities to his core administrative role, developing and leading a \$70 million physician services business unit that included a free-standing cancer center, a Management Services Organization which provided administrative support for an IPA and various medical groups, ambulatory clinics for the residency programs, and over 600 of the organization's employees. Dr. Feaster also served at the organization's CIO in an interim role.

In 2002, Dr. Feaster returned to practice, first as a general practice anesthesiologist in Fresno, and then in October 2002 relocated to Stanford University. His initial role at Stanford, in addition to practicing pediatric anesthesia, was Vice President of Ambulatory Care and Director of a new Faculty Practice Organization for pediatrics and obstetrical practices at Lucile Packard Children's Hospital. In 2006, after four years serving on LPCH's senior leadership team and leading the formation of this faculty practice, Dr. Feaster returned to full-time practice and currently serves as a Clinical Professor of Anesthesia and Pediatrics for the Stanford School of Medicine. In addition to his current academic responsibilities, Dr. Feaster is the medical director of peri-operative informatics, provides physician leadership to the hospital's peri-operative services, and recently implemented an electronic anesthesia information system for pediatric anesthesia.

Dr. Feaster is an active member of several medical societies, including the American Academy of Pediatrics and the California Society of Anesthesiologists. For the CSA, he currently serves on the Board as Director of District 4 and is a member of the Legislative and Practice Affairs Division. He recently chaired the Membership Committee, and will be leading the Communications

Committee this upcoming year. Over the years, he has been a consultant for various medical corporations, including Nellcor, Inc., and sits on Covidien's medical advisory board.

In June, he will assume the role of Chairman of the Board of the Lasallian Education Fund, a philanthropic organization that supports scholarships for at-risk youth at private Christian Brother schools throughout the Western United States.

Dr. Feaster lives in Half Moon Bay, California, with his wife of 28 years, Sandi.
