Description of Fellowship: The Department of Anesthesia at Stanford University Medical Center offers a 6-12 month fellowship in perioperative management of non-cardiac thoracic surgery at the CA-5 level. The fellow will be involved in the perioperative care of patients undergoing thoracic surgery including preoperative evaluation and preparation, and intraoperative and post-operative management. As an integral part of the thoracic anesthesia team, the fellow will work closely with the Thoracic Surgical Division of the Department of Cardiothoracic and Vascular Surgery including participation in conferences and clinics. The fellow will be expected to participate in ongoing clinical research projects and is encouraged to initiate other studies in the area during the fellowship. A fellowship with emphasis on specific needs of the applicant can be designed.

We currently perform approximately 150-200 major thoracotomies and thoracoscopies per year at Stanford Hospital. The number of pediatric thoracic surgery cases is also growing and the fellow will be involved in the care of these patients as well. Further arrangements can be made for exposure to additional clinical cases at the Stanford Veteran's Administration Hospital. The fellow will also have the opportunity to work with the cardiac anesthesia team doing heart-lung and lung transplantation.
